




Learning Expo

School Year Metrics in Review

As you may know, the PowerSave Campus Program focuses on many areas of Sustainability, including actual and potential savings, workforce, academic infusion, and outreach. Over the 2012-2013 school year, the team has accomplished many great things through various projects. Since last May, we, have saved over 133,000 kWh and 22,400 gallons of water on campus, mainly through organizing competitions such as the Mega Energy Competition and Campus Conservation Nationals. If you combine that with potential savings, the team has helped save nearly \$60,000 in water and energy over the past school year! Also, in the past year, we have attended and organized 5 workforce events, including our very successful Green Career Panel in February and multiple Energy Hog events. This school year also marked the release of our Sustainability Course Guide, our academic infusion project that has received nearly 1500 views over three quarters of releases and won a Best Practice Award at the California Higher Education Sustainability Conference this summer! Lastly, we have had massive amounts of outreach over the school year, reaching out to nearly 5000 people at different events and another 6000 people reached remotely via Facebook and YouTube. This year also introduced the requirement of Community projects for the PowerSave Campus teams, which CPP's team has been more than happy to accomplish with the Nancy McCracken Learning Expo, the McCoy Equestrian Center Earth Day event, and our Girl Scouts project. Yes, the past school year has been a greatly productive one indeed, but the team has even higher hopes for the 2013-2014 year! Thank you for all your support and we look forward to what the future has in store for Sustainability at Cal Poly Pomona!

SHUT THE SASH Campaign

Shut the Sash campaign has been executed across many campuses encouraging students to shut the sash of fume hoods. An unknown piece of machinery found in nearly all science labs, are "devices designed for work with toxic or hazardous chemicals with the effect of safely capturing the harmful gases, vapors, and fumes generated and exhausting them to the outside air" (Safe Hood Use Guide from Cornell University). Fume hoods account for a huge amount of energy usage on all college campuses. In fact, the average fume hood uses enough energy to power 3.5 households! However this means there are potential savings of nearly 60%! The interns along with the great support of Energy Manager George Lwin and Dean of Science Brian Jersky, will be holding a Shut the Sash Campaign here at Cal Poly Pomona in the Biological Science building. In the past weeks there has been much preparation including a baseline usage survey and student use survey that produced interesting results. While most students were aware of the safety precautions dealing with fume hoods, many stated that in the past week, they never shut the sash of the fume hood when it was not in use. After surveying the fume hoods left on a Friday night, this is accurate. Nearly 80% fume hood sashes were above 3 inches. So how can we encourage students to Shut the Sash? The interns want to primarily educate students in different ways, for example we developed a detailed presentation that can be easily accessed online where students and staff can watch videos, see the student survey results and learn about other ways they can save energy in the lab. Although the school year is quickly coming to a close, the week long campaign will surely produce amazing savings.
